Contest Purpose

To instill a better knowledge and appreciation of the Constitution of the United States in high school students.

Development of leadership qualities, the ability to think and speak clearly, and the preparation of acceptance of the duties, responsibilities, rights and privileges of American citizenship.

To assist students in paying the high cost of a college education.

Eligibility

Contestants must either live within or attend an educational institution within the State of Washington

Contestants must be sponsored by an American Legion Post, Auxiliary Unit, SAL Squadron, Riders Chapter or District in the State of Washington

Contestants must be bona fide students who are presently enrolled in a high school or junior high school (public, parochial, military, private or home school) in which the curriculum of said school is considered to be of high school level, commencing with grade nine (9) and terminating with grade twelve (12). Students must be enrolled in high school or junior high school during the time of participation at any level of the contest.

Contestants must be citizens of or lawful permanent residents of the United States.

So, what do I have to do during the contest?

- During the contest you will have to speak twice
 - The Prepared Oration
 - 8-10 minutes long
 - Cover some aspect of the Constitution of the United States
 - Emphasize the duties and obligations of a citizen to our government
 - Must be original work of the contestant
 - Must be memorized and delivered in English
 - The "Assigned Topic" Speech
 - 3-5 minutes long
 - One of the four Assigned Topics will be drawn at random during the contest
 - Each contestant is given 5 minutes to prepare prior to delivery of speech
 - You should be prepared in advance to speak on all 4 topics!

- Your presentations will be done before an audience
 - No podium or lectern
 - No microphone
 - No notes
 - No props
 - No help or prompting from the audience
- Your presentations will be timed
- Your presentations will be judged

Where and When is the Contest?

The contest will be held at Ephrata High School the weekend of March 22-23, 2024. A <u>mandatory</u> pre-contest orientation for all contestants is held at 8:00pm on Friday evening, March 22nd. (lodging arrangements furnished & mileage allowance will be provided to contestants)

Scholarships totaling \$5,000 will be awarded to the 1st thru 4th place students taking part in the State Finals contest. The State winner will receive a \$2,000 scholarship, plus an expenses paid trip to Hillsdale, Michigan, to compete in the National Finals Contest for a part of the \$203,000 national scholarship pool.

The National Finals Contest will be held the weekend of May 17-19, 2024. You are expected to be there all 3 days.
